


#### **Treatment teams**

- ► MUST understand the drug itself and the damage it causes
- ► Requires a significant level of competency/ training


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#### Impulsive and dangerous behavior

"Superman"

Risky sexual behavior

Psychosis during and after use



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#### **Withdrawal Symptoms**

- Cognitive impairment
- Severe depression
- Heart palpitations
- Hallucinations
- Chronic fatigue
- o Insomnia
- Paranoia
- Tremors




You need medical collaboration!

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#### **Traumatic Brain Injury**

- Meth is neuro-toxic: it kills brain cells
- □ Can mirror TBI or PTSD
- Ongoing paranoia due to dramatic changes in brain chemistry
- Currently no medications to reduce psychiatric symptoms




Recovery of Brain Function with Prolonged Abstinence

#### Sense of futility

"Nobody ever recovers"

"Why is everyone getting better but me?"

- Anhedonia
- Withdrawal is too painful
- o "I'm not brave enough"
- Meth users recover slower than others
- Mixed treatment groups can be demoralizing





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
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

Justice system is often the entry point







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## Intensive Case Management: Mental Health Services

Include early in tx process

Distinguish btn drug-induced and pre-drug abuse mental health issues

Address Psychotherapeutic needs

Medications as appropriate

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## Intensive Case Management: Medical Collaboration

Medical issues often emerge during recovery

- Always treat for malnutrition, vitamin deficiency, depression, memory deficits
- Screen for Hepatitis, HIV, sexual assault, infections of various types

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#### **Additional Strategies**

- Mentors or alumni supports
- Structured social activities and daily calendar
- □ Family wrap-around services
- Employment
- □ Physical exercise, brain exercise
- After care

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## Family/ Clan: "Poverty is being without relatives"

Reconnecting the "sick" person with the family and community is central to the healing process

Research shows that American Indians are less likely to identify clan or family as a stressor

Treatment programs that allow the whole family to address their addiction together

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## Family/ Clan: How should the court respond?



Some judges order the whole family into tx, attend educational workshops on meth

Court must be responsive to the important role family and clan play in healing

Elder panels from defendant's clan

Opportunities for family to observe court, interact with staff

Supervised visitation of children or nieces/nephews

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## Traditional Healing: Integration in the court process

#### Innovative court sanctions and incentives

- Elder mentoring
- Beading and regalia making
- Outdoor activities (gathering sage or wild rice, spearfishing, hunting)

#### Immersion in trad'l healing practices

- Indigenous roots/ tea
- Healing ceremonies (sweats, pipe, drumming, naming)

#### Collaboration btn trad'l healers and "Western" medicine/ mental health services

 Sioux San Behavioral Health Services Matrix Model

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#### **Traditional Healing:** Does it work? "Western" system of Studies show that Al medicine is used to respond to trad'l address physical healers treating symptoms; psychological distress, Trad'l medicine tends substance abuse, to address the physical health and circumstances from which symptoms arose.

## **Identity:** Positive identity/ psychological wellness

- Enculturation
