IHS Domestic Violence Prevention Initiative (DVPI)

- National surveys indicate high rates of DV & SA in Indian Country
- ▶ 2009 PL 11–8, the Omnibus Appropriations Act & congress: \$10 million for DVPI
- Purpose: support national effort by IHS to address DV and SA in AI/AN communities
- Funding for SANE/SART expansion, DV or SA advocacy - tribal and IHS programs/projects
- CLIHS 1 of 8 SANE/SART expansion sites funded nationally
 - Have expanded to include DV

Federal IHS DVPI Program

- National Sexual Assault Protocol
 - Nation-wide IHS protocol of response to sexual assault victims
 - Mandates access to SANEs to provide exams
 - Standardized equipment
- National Domestic Violence Protocol
- Being developed
- Webinars and other trainings and information-sharing opportunities
 - Domestic Violence Examiner training

Cass Lake IHS SADVPI Program

- ▶ SANE expansion
- ▶ Reservation-wide SARRT/DARRT
 - 4 counties
 - Law enforcement, prosecution, advocacy, corrections, child protection, FACNM +
- ▶ Improve IHS internal response
- Community awareness raising
- Professional education



Leech Lake Reservation

- >8,000 members & 12,000 residents
- ▶ 973 sq miles
- ▶ Total surface area including water 1,310 sq miles
- > 2,507 acres (6%) tribally owned
- Remainder:
 - 1/3 federal (Chippewa National Forest)
 - American Indians on fee/privately owned property
 - State, companies, non-native land owners
- ▶ Encompasses parts of 4 counties
- Minn. is PL 280 state









Cass Lake IHS

- Circa 1937
- 12,000 patients
- Critical access hospital
- 11 in pt & swing beds
- 100,000 pt visits annually



Survey of 32 female patients

- > 27 would prefer to come to our facility if SA
 - "This is MY hospital"
 - "...they'd be more caring and helpful"
- ▶ 31 felt victims would come if SANE available
 - "As long as the people know there is someone there to help them. Greatly needed on the rez."
 - "Some providers treat rape victims with no compassion"
- 31 felt it important to have program specific to AI/AN

CLIHS SADVPI Major Accomplishments: Cass Lake IHS

- ▶ 24/7 SANE coverage
 - Training of SANEs to provide DV forensic nurse service
- CLIHS SANE equipment & training
- SA protocol & forms
- DV & strangulation protocol & forms
- ▶ Employee trainings on SA & DV

CLIHS SADVPI Major Accomplishments: Improving Multidisciplinary Responses

- ▶ Formation of SARRT/DARRT
 - Sexual Assault MOU
 - Safety & Accountability Audit: "What is the response to sexual assault and domestic violence on the Leech Lake Reservation?"
 - · Interviews, focus groups, surveys, listening sessions
 - Strangulation & DV MDT guidelines in progress
- 2 Regional SANE/SARRT trainings
- > 3 Regional multidisciplinary trainings
- Safe Dates training
- DAIP batterer's group facilitator training
- SANE & Advocate Summit



Our Greatest Challenges

- Encouraging victims to present for medical care
- Changing norms
 - $\,{}^{_{\odot}}$ Identify and change messages that encourage VAW
- Changing community responses
 - Holding perpetrators accountable
 - Responses to victims
 - · Threats, intimidation
 - Victim blaming
- Changing systems responses
 - Becoming more victim-centered
 - Reaching those who need it most

Other Challenges

- Trying to do it all while understaffed!
- Trying to much of anything in the winter!
- Restrictions on appropriated fund spending
 - We need to be able to feed people!
 - Items such as t-shirts
 - Limited to \$25 gas card

The Fruits/Rewards of our Labor

- "People are talking about it. Everywhere I go I hear people talking about sexual assault and domestic violence."
- LL Chief of Police: "Thank you for everything you are doing. It has changed the way we work. Now in a domestic violence situation we ask ourselves "Is she afraid?". If the answer is yes we take him in and let the courts figure it out from there."
