## INDIAN COUNTRY TRENDS IN MONTANA

- Native Americans are victims of Intimate Partner
  Homicide (IPH) at an elevated rate. While constituting
  approximately 7% of the state's population, they
  make up 14% of IPH incidents and 10% of IPH deaths.
- Statewide, in 30% of IPH the killer is a female. In Indian Country that number = 58%.
- Off-Reservation, men tend to use firearms when killing their partner; women most often use a knife.
   In Indian Country female-perpetrated deaths, knives have been used more than 80% of the time.
- All Native American IPH incidents involve NA victims and perpetrators – no non-Natives.
- There have been no Native American familicides.



 Overall, Native American IPH deaths in MT have declined in the past two years. Last month, however, there were 2 IPH events on two different Reservations within one week, resulting in the deaths of one man and one woman. Native Americans continue to be victims of intimate partner homicide at a disproportionate rate in our state.
